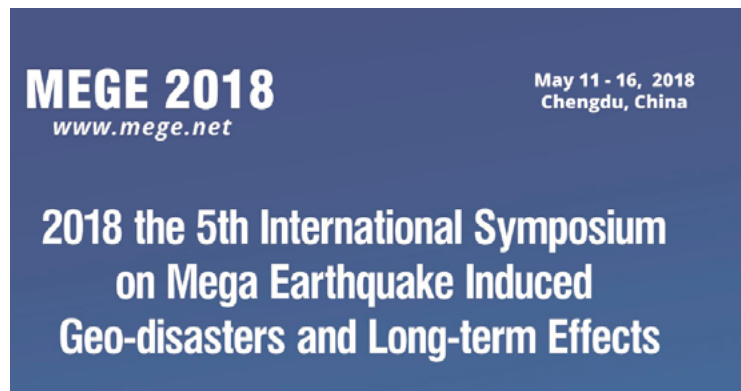

About Mege 2018

Ten years ago, a devastating earthquake occurred in Sichuan Province, China, causing the death of almost 90,000 people and widespread damage to urban and rural communities, deeply affecting the economy of the region. The earthquake triggered tens of thousands of landslides over a large area, and rainstorms in the years after the earthquake re-activated many of them, triggering debris flows from their deposits. Even though strategies for geo-hazards assessment and risk management have been implemented to reduce the long-term disaster-chain effects from the earthquake, 10 years on, the Wenchuan region still is threatened by various geo-hazards in the aftermath of the earthquake. Spatial and temporal trends in these threats raise international awareness and concerns about the issues of long-term disaster-chain effects in hazard and risk reduction.

Global trends of climate change, environmental destruction and explosive population growth are further increasing the frequency and impact of geo-hazards. There is urgent international need for opportunities to exchange up-to-date knowledge on the nature of geo-hazards and on risk-reduction techniques, among researchers, engineers and decision makers at national, regional and local levels. Chengdu University of Technology, through the State Key Laboratory of Geo-hazard Prevention and Geo-environment

Protection (SKLGP) has been pro-active in promoting such exchanges. We have hosted five successful international symposia to date in memory of the earthquake victims. These are the “Asian Regional Conference of IAEG” in 2009, “The International Symposium on Earthquake-induced Landslides and Disaster Mitigation at the 3rd Anniversary of the Wenchuan Earthquake” in 2011; “The International Symposium in Commemoration of the 5th Anniversary of the 2008 Wenchuan Earthquake: Long-term Geo-hazard and Risk Consequences of Areas Struck by High Magnitude Earthquakes” in 2013; and the “4th International Symposium on Mega-earthquake-induced Geo-disasters and Long-term Effects” in 2015. Building on these experiences and their social benefits the 10th anniversary of the 2008 Wenchuan mega-earthquake, Chengdu University of Technology through SKLGP will host “The 5th International Symposium on Mega-earthquake-induced Geo-disasters and Long-term Effects” in May 2018 in memory of the many victims. It will provide opportunity to present and exchange international knowledge and experience on the occurrence of geo-hazards in areas struck by mega-earthquakes and their long-term effects.

1. 60th Anniversary Symposium of JSEG

In March, we Japanese people remember the dreadful Tsunami and earthquake of magnitude 9.0 disaster occurred on March 11, 2011, Pacific coast area of Northeast Japan. About 20 thousand people were lost by enormous Tsunami and earthquake shock. Four power plants of Fukushima No.1 nuclear power plants were destroyed by the Tsunami of 15m high, and 74 thousand refugee people still cannot return to their home.

The JSEG will hold the 60th Anniversary Symposium on June 29-30, 2018 in Tokyo. The theme of this symposium will be “Disaster experiences during recent 10 years and message to future generation”.

Increasing number of natural disasters caused by earthquake, extreme heavy rain, and volcanism etc. occurred in recent ten years in Japan. JSEG has gained the knowledge and technology of disaster prevention, caution and forecast, through disaster investigation for Hiroshima debris flow in 2014, Kumamoto earthquake in 2016 and Northern Kyusyu debris flow in 2017. We will discuss our future action and role according to recent activities and research results of JSEG members. We will invite Dr. Toshiaki Kawada (Kyoto Univ.) and Dr. Ranjan Kumar Dahal (Tribhuvan Univ. Nepal) for special lectures and have one day excursion for disaster prevention of big Tokyo city.

2. Excursion team for Nepal

Japan National Group participated in the ARC-11 held on Nov. 28-30 at Kathmandu and the field excursion EX-5 on Dec. 1-2, in 2017. EX-5 was JSEG special 3-days excursion of geology and topography along the route from Kathmandu to Pokara. Participants of this EX-5

1. Organization of the Biannual “National Symposium on Engineering Geology and Geotechnics – MUHJEO’2017”

The Second of the biennial “National Symposium on Engineering Geology and Geotechnics” was held in collaboration with the Çukurova and Mersin Universities in Adana on 12th -14th October, 2017. The website of the symposium is accessible at www.muhjeoder.org.tr

About 250 participants from 18 universities, 8 governmental companies, and 15 private sector companies with 44 orals and a keynote lecture given by Prof. Dr. Mahir Vardar (ITU) have contributed to the symposium.

/5. BULLETIN GOING ON DIGITAL FROM 2019

The official academic journal of the IAEG, the “**Bulletin of Engineering Geology and the Environment**,” is going to be published on-line only from the start of 2019. The following description will help you have a better understanding of the change.

Why does the Bulletin need to switch to on-line only publication?

International scientific journals are moving towards digital-only publication. From 2019 the Bulletin will match this trend and switch to on-line only publication. The Bulletin will use the Continuous Article Publishing (CAP) publication model. Two advantages of this change are faster publication and lower publication costs.

What does the switch to CAP mean?

From the start of 2019, as soon as articles are accepted and the production process is completed, they will immediately be published in an issue. Instead of consecutive pagination of articles throughout a volume, each article will have an internal pagination beginning with page 1. In addition, every article will receive an Article Citation ID number. This unique article identifier will be visible on every page of an article and will replace the page numbers in the citation line. As a result, all articles will have their full and final citation information available as soon as the production process is complete. This change does not affect the production time from acceptance to on-line publication of an article, but since the articles will be published on-line immediately in their final form, the overall publication time for articles will become shorter as preparation of articles for printing will no longer be needed. This change means that members of the IAEG who pay for the Bulletin will cease to receive a paper copy and will receive the ‘on-line’ version only.
