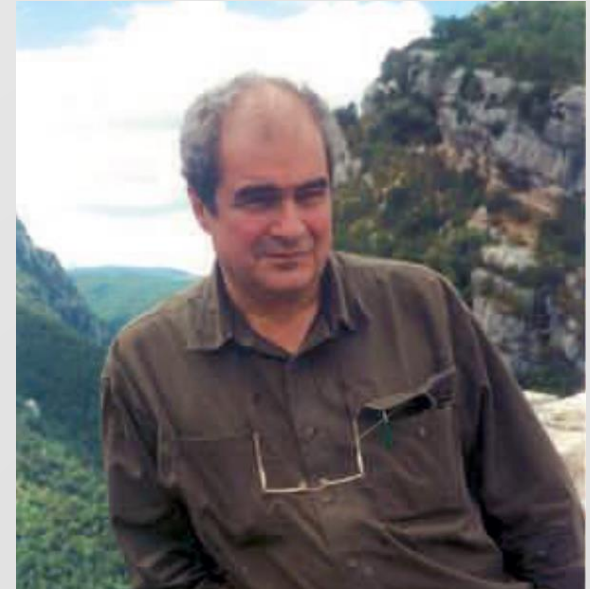
— CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

A newly established award by the International Association for Engineering Geology and the Environment (IAEG) to commemorate the contributions in the field of Engineering Geology of the Past President and Honorary President of the Association the late Professor Paul Marinos.

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Professor Paul G. Marinos (1944 -2021)

- ❑ He was a leading figure of the profession as **President of the International Association for Engineering Geology and the Environment (IAEG)** as an academic and as a technical expert.
- ❑ His endeavors advanced the state-of the art on a variety of applications of Engineering Geology.
- ❑ **Paul Marinos promoted IAEG and our profession with hundreds of lectures around the World in:**
 - North America (“Jahns Distinguished Lecturer” with 68 lectures in 19 States, Cross-Canada Lecturer in 12 Universities and others)
 - Asia (more than 20 lecture series in China, Malaysia, Nepal, Japan, Myanmar, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam, Iran, India)
 - Australia and New Zealand (numerous in Perth, Adelaide, Melbourne, Sidney, Newcastle, Brisbane, Auckland, Christchurch)
 - Europe (dozens of lectures in almost all European countries, Glossop Lecture and visiting professor in France, Switzerland, UK, Italy) and
 - over than 50 keynote lectures around the world.





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General Framework

The Lecture Tour

The IAEG Executive Committee is seeking nominations. This lectureship provides the opportunity for an **Engineering Geologist of outstanding merit who, through research or practice, has contributed to the advancement of Engineering Geology and Environment, to present a series of lectures** about Engineering Geology and Environmental Geology in a two-year period to a diverse audience of professionals, academics and students around the world.

Nominations

- Nomination will normally be made by a National/Regional Group but members of the Executive Committee and Council may also propose individuals.
- Nominees must not be currently serving on IAEG Executive Committee.

Lecture Tour Organization

- The **Distinguished Lecturer** is expected to give lectures **in all regions (Europe, Asia, Australasia, Africa, North and Latin America)** during their tenure (**two-year period**).
- The respective VP will be responsible to support the organization of the lectures after communicating with all relevant National/Regional Groups (NG/RG) that wish to host this prestigious IAEG lecture.
- The number of lectures in each region can be decided based on the availability of the lecturer and in consultation with the local IAEG representatives-officers.
- Travel and other expenses are reimbursed either by the host institution and/or sponsors and/or IAEG.





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Nominee characteristics

01

Member of IAEG.

02

A person of international repute who has made a major contribution to Engineering Geology in his/her written papers or to the development of Engineering Geology.

03

An expert in Engineering Geology and Environment with various consultancy activities regarding important construction works which addressed very challenging engineering geology problems.

04

Expected to represent the International Association for Engineering Geology and Environment as an effective ambassador for the profession and scientific society.

05

An experienced and articulate public speaker who is comfortable speaking to different audiences in English in person.

06

Willing to volunteer personal time to instruct and share knowledge with other IAEG members.

07

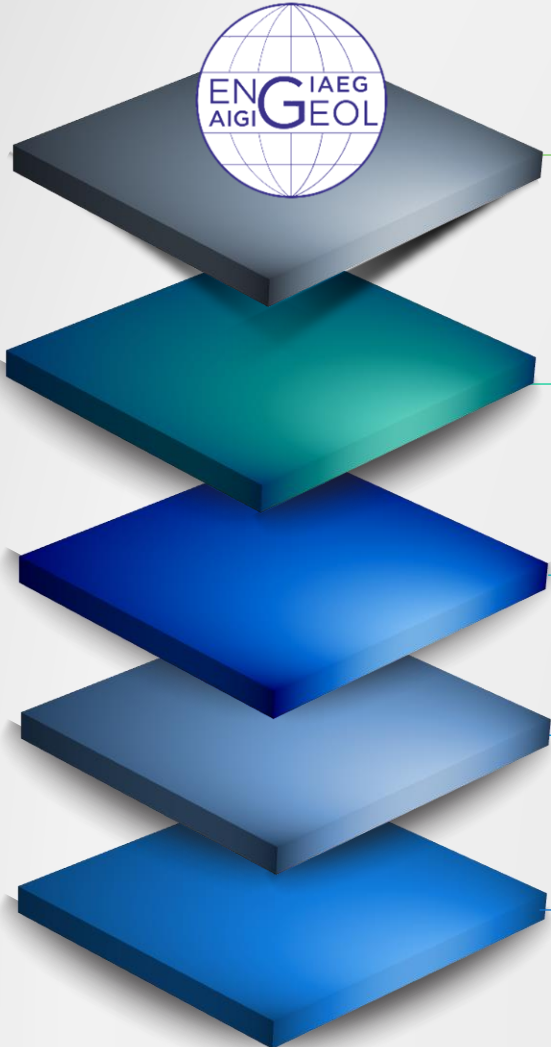
Willing to travel to all regions of IAEG (Europe, Asia, Australasia, Africa, North and Latin America) and give at least 2 lectures in each region in two-year period. A number of 4-5 lectures per region, though, is generally expected, based on the financial possibilities



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Documentation to accompany distinguished lecturer nomination

The nomination should be submitted to the Secretary General including the following documents:



(1) Curriculum Vitae with

- a. Brief summary of accomplishments, honors, awards that establish the Lecture candidate's preeminence in Engineering Geology.
- b. List of publications identifying the three most important papers in Engineering Geology.

(2) A 5-minute video of the Candidate presenting his/her nomination, including a brief overview of his/her career to date, with a focus on career highlights relevant to the nomination and content related to the topic(s) he/she would offer as lectures during the tour, with emphasis on components related to Engineering Geology and the environment, considering the global IAEG audience.

(3) Topic areas on which the nominee might be invited to lecture.

(4) A statement of support for the nominee by the nominating body which demonstrates the candidate's service to the IAEG and to the engineering geological profession in his/her region and/or given outstanding lecture skills. The statement should not be longer than two pages A4 pages.

(5) Explicit agreement from the nominee that his/her lectures can be recorded to be published in IAEG web platforms, if nominated



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Selection procedure

2. Submission of nominations

Nominations are submitted by National/Regional Groups of IAEG and may also be proposed by members of the Executive Committee (ExCom) & the Council.

1. Call for nominations.

The call is published via the IAEG website, social media, newsletter, and E-Connector.

4. Result Announcement

Paul Marinos distinguished world tour lecturer winner within the same year as the call for nominations.

3. Evaluation and final selection.

An international evaluation committee (Jury / Selection Committee) is established, composed of experienced and distinguished members of IAEG from both academia and professional practice, with representation from different geographical regions.

The committee **evaluates all candidates** based on defined criteria and establishes a ranking, from which the leading candidate is identified.
